Bamboo Painting

Course Description

This course focuses primarily on bamboo painting. It will teach you how to paint the bamboo shoots, stalks, branches and leaves in a variety of ways and mediums. Learn how to load the brush with multiple tones of ink/paint, how to paint bamboo using calligraphic strokes. Subjects will also include flying birds, the giant panda, a bamboo grove in a landscape scene, and the Three Friends of Winter.

For the beginner, this course can act as a comprehensive introduction to bamboo painting and themes and offers lots of bamboo practise.

For the more experienced, this course can act as a series of masterclasses with the aim of polishing up previously learnt skills and offer lots of bamboo practise.

No knowledge of art or Chinese is required.

Course Outline:

Lesson 1: Bamboo Shoots, Stalks and Branches

Learning Objectives:

- 1. To learn and practise how to paint the bamboo shoots with the tip and belly of the brush.
- 2. To learn and practise how to paint the stalks by loading a hake brush with multiple tones of ink and/or watercolour.
- 3. To learn and practise how to paint the stalks with the bone stroke.

- 4. To learn and practise how to paint the bamboo joints calligraphically with the horizontal and hook stroke.
- 5. To learn and practise how to paint the branches using bone strokes.
- 6. To paint bamboo shoots, bamboo stalks, joints and branches.

Lesson 2: Bamboo Leaves

Learning Objectives:

- 1. To learn and practise how to paint the bamboo leaves in the fish tail formation for young bamboo, spring bamboo or overhanging bamboo.
- 2. To learn and practise how to paint the bamboo leaves in the flying goose formation for older bamboo.
- 3. To learn and practise how to paint the bamboo leaves in the swallow's tail formation for older bamboo.
- 4. To paint bamboo leaves (including stalks if necessary) in a variety of ways, in a variety of compositions.

Lesson 3: Small Flying Birds and Bamboo

Learning Objectives:

- 1. To learn and practise how to paint small yellow/blue birds with very few minimalist strokes with few details.
- 2. To learn and practise how to paint small yellow/blue birds flying in a bamboo composition.
- 3. To paint a bamboo composition with flying yellow/blue birds.

Lesson 4: Bamboo Grove in a Landscape Scene

Learning Objectives:

- 1. To learn and practise how to paint a bamboo grove with ink.
- 2. To learn and practise how to use indigo to add depth to the grove.
- 3. To learn and practise how to paint distant houses and buildings to suggest the idea of habitation and settlement.
- 4. To learn and practise how to paint the scholars rock using the outline approach and a dry brush for texture.
- 5. To paint a landscape scene showing a bamboo grove with distant houses and rocks.

Lesson 5: Bamboo & the Giant Panda in the style of Wu Zuoren

Learning Objectives:

- 1. To learn and practise how to paint facial details of the giant panda with dry ink.
- 2. To learn and practise how to bleed ink into an ink tone to create a furry effect.
- 3. To learn and practise how to paint the giant panda in a variety of positions.
- 4. To paint the giant panda on a rock with bamboo in the background.

Lesson 6: Bamboo and the Three Friends of Winter Learning Objectives:

- 1. To be introduced to the Three Friends of Winter in Chinese culture.
- 2. To learn and practise how to paint minimalist bamboo in a composition.
- 3. To learn and practise how to paint minimalist plum blossom in a composition.
- 4. To learn and practise how to paint minimalist pine in a composition.
- 5. To paint the Three Friends of Winter as a composition.
