3) A short statement of support from the main supervisor, confirming that they endorse the training activity and that they will not have a negative impact on the student's research and writing process.

Please note: All applications must contain a signed statement of support from the main supervisor. In addition, if applying for the Oxford DH Summer School, students and supervisor must undertake to complete their end-of-year panel and progression requirements before the Oxford DH Summer School begins on Monday 2nd July 2018.

## Digital Humanities Postgraduate Research Travel and Training Call 2017-18

Funding decisions for the Travel and Training award will be announced by **March 16<sup>th</sup> 2018**. All expenditure on successful bids should be completed by July 31st 2018. A brief report (no more than one side of A4) should be submitted within one month of the award end date. This should identify and describe specific benefits and outcomes resulting from the award, and outline plans for any further developments and initiatives. We may use selected reports as the basis to publicise the benefits of the fund. All successful recipients will also be asked to share their findings in a future digital humanities workshop.

## Eligibility:

All registered PGR students in the Faculty of Humanities. Two or more individuals may combine forces and submit a joint application, e.g. to bring an external expert to Manchester.
