Manchester Interdisciplinary Collaboration for Research on Ageing (MICRA)

Seedcorn Funding

October 2010 - call for applications

The aim of MICRA seedcorn funding is to further ageing related research within the University of Manchester. Applications should meet the following criteria:

- 1. The proposed research must be related to ageing. Applications are particularly encouraged around the current MICRA themes:
 - Health inequalities
- Musculoskeletal/pain

Frailty

- Mental health and wellbeing
- Genetics of ageing
- Work and retirement
- 2. The proposed research must be interdisciplinary (for example, crossing the funding domains of two or more research councils)
- 3. The proposed research must lead to at least one specific outcome, such as a research proposal for a research council or a working paper.
- 4. A maximum of £6K can be awarded per application; awarded funds must be spent by the end of July 2011.
- 5. The award must be held by a University of Manchester member of staff, but can be used to fund collaborations with other institutions.
- 6. Publicity related to the research must include reference to MICRA
- 7. Successful applicants are required to submit a one page summary of research outcomes to MICRA by the end of July 2011.

Application process:

- 1. Applicants are required to submit a written proposal for their research totalling no more than two sides of A4.
- 2. The proposal should state how the research meets the above criteria (items 1 to 5).
- 3. The deadline for applications is Friday 17 December 2010; submissions should be made via email to <u>micra@manchester.ac.uk</u>. Methods@Manchester is running a similar competition around social science methodology; it is possible for a proposal to receive funding from both MICRA and Methods@Manchester (<u>www.methods.manchester.ac.uk</u>).
- 4. The MICRA funding panel will meet in January 2011 to make their decision; the panel consists of:
