## Reported

- 1. In respect of annual reviews, it was agreed that the reviewers should be notified of what stage the student was at on their programme
- 2. The rules on written work for annual reviews should be tightened up

## <u>Agreed</u>

Starting from September 2017, it was agreed that it should be compulsory for second year students to present at the PGR Conference. This would not apply to MPhil students and exceptions could be made, but only with mitigating circumstances.

## 3. Chair's Report

#### Reported

- 1. At a Faculty marketing meeting, a marketing pilot being done by SoSS and SEED was discussed. It was felt that in respect of PGR marketing, the School's website was poor, but work was being done to improve this. The following possibilities for the website were discussed: a video on the website about the PGR environment; academics' work; an allocated webspace "What's New this Month".
- 2. For the ESRC Studentships, 5 applications had been received: 4 for the Criminology pathway; 1 for the Socio-Legal pathway. Two applications (both Criminology) had been put forward for consideration. If these were not successful for the ESRC Studentships, they could be considered for the Law School Scholarships.

## 4. Admissions Report

## Reported

The numbers and quality of applications had risen. For September 2017 intake, 25 offers had been made. These included some deferred applications. The overseas offers had increased, but the home offers had decreased. It had been thought that the introduction of interviews might slow the process down, but this had not occurred and it was felt that this had improved the quality of applicants.
