

# **BA Philosophy**

#### What you will study

This document gives you a flavour of what you might study as part of a Philosophy at Manchester.

Each year of your degree you need to take units that add up to 120 credits.

Each unit is made up of 10 or 20 credits. This reflects the amount of work involved, so for every one credit you should do approximately 10 hours of work (eg lectures, tutorials, office hours and independent study).

Each of the course units below has **pre-requisites** – **other course units which you need to have taken the year before**. You can find information about these by clicking on the particular course unit information pages.

The actual units taught will depend on the availability of staff.

# Year 1

You will have one compulsory unit for Philosophy

Course unit	Credit
Critical Thinking	20

You would then choose your remaining 100 credits.

80 credits of these (or at least 4 course units) would need to be from Philosophy:

Discovering Reality	20
Mind and World	20

You can choose your final 20 credits from the Philosophy courses above or from outside the discipline.

You could choose other social sciences or courses from across the University so long as they are first year courses and are open to all students.

For example, you can choose things such as a language through the LEAP scheme (Language Experience for All Programmes).

#### Year 2

You would need to choose at least one analytical methodology course from:

You would also need to choose one course unit from:

You would then need to choose your remaining 80 units. At least 60 of these should come from the list below: (You will only be allowed to select one of the Politics course units as part of this.)

#### Free choice units

As part of the 120 units in your second year you can choose to take up to 20 units of courses that are not part of your second year options with the approval of your programme director.

# Year 3

In your final year you will do a supervised dissertation. You can choose to do a 20 unit or 40 unit version:

You will then choose the rest of your 120 units (either 80 or 100 depending on the dissertation you have chosen) from the list below.
