Box of Broadcasts (BoB) is an on-demand TV and Radio recording service for education and enables all staff and students at the University to view and record programmes, create clips and playlists, search transcripts, and share broadcasts from over 75 free-to-air TV and Radio channels.

MS Teams as a Supportive Learning Environment - Beginner Level

Getting Started with Adobe Express

Adobe Express is a web-based app that harnesses powerful tools to allow users to quickly and easily create web resources, graphics and videos. During the session you will not only learn how to use the app to design and publish various projects, but also how Adobe Express can be incorporated into active learning activities within teaching and how it can be used by students.

Introduction to VoiceThread

VoiceThread is a tool which allows users to create and collaborate on a multimedia slideshow which can incorporate text, images, documents, audio and video in one presentation. It can also foster engagement with it's innovative commenting feature. This session will demonstrate how to create, share and comment on presentations, as well as how VoiceThread can be used in teaching and assessment.


Assessment and Feedback | 4 May 2023 with Gilian Ulph & Eleanor Aspey
