This is the third annual report into the state of the North's economy. In 2014 we analysed how the North has changed over the previous decade. We showed how much variation and there is across the North, and shed light on the complex challenges faced by the region. In 2015 we set out four tests for the Government's Northern Powerhouse.

This year we want to build on this, and look at recent changes and future challenges, by analysing data across themes such as North's economy, society and environment.
