100 word abstract of what the project would probably undertake, and any data to be used:

This Spring, the College of Policing is launching a new "Direct Entry to Inspector" scheme, alongside recruiting the next cohort of "Direct Entry to Superintendent" programme members. An online survey will be sent to everyone that registers an interest in applying to either scheme, gathering basic demographic data and data on their reasons for applying or not and how they heard about the programme. The Q-Step intern would analyse the results of this survey and potentially, results from a small trial of different marketing messages that were sent to registrants before they applied, aimed at attracting people from diverse groups.
