100 word abstract of what the project would probably undertake, and any data to be used:

My current research project investigates resilience in later life by characterising, exploring and explaining how some people manage to limit the impact of adverse events. One important aspect of this is mapping out who is vulnerable to these events. With the aim of making infographics, the intern would summarize the relevant information out of the English Longitudinal Study of Ageing (ELSA) and make up statistical profiles of those who have experienced an adverse event, such as loss of health, wealth or partner, and look for creative, accessible and novel ways to present these data online and in print.
