undertake, and any data to be used:**

The project will develop quantitative data analysis tools to be utilised by social change projects led by young people through the RECLAIM Institute. These tools will then be utilised to assess the impact of two recently established youth-led consultancy services:

1. REIGN – a training and consultancy service led by four survivors of child sexual exploitation, that improves the knowledge of social workers, the police and other stakeholders through strengths-based workshops.
2. Educating All – a consultancy service that facilitates student-centred research into the barriers working class young people face at university, and finds solutions tailored to individual institutions.
