## 100 word abstract of what the project would probably undertake, and any data to be used:

Major changes to the benefits system have come into force in the last few years, including the Benefit Cap, the bedroom tax and the roll out of Universal Credit. The Government is now planning to introduce new welfare reforms under the Welfare and Work Bill.

Catalyst is a housing association that aims to create a self-sustaining business, which uses commercial disciplines and profits to provide affordable homes, improve neighbourhoods and change lives. We are therefore looking for someone to help us to:

- Work with relevant teams to design and build scenario data models to assess the impact of Welfare Reform on key business outcomes, using external population data sources to supplement these models where required.
- Review and understand internal Welfare Reform policies and approaches against the external environment, working closely with relevant support and operational teams.
- Identify key outcomes for measuring success, both operationally and strategically
- Review all data Catalyst collects regarding Welfare Reform and make recommendations for improvement
