100 word abstract of what the project would probably undertake, and any data to be used:

The Centre on Dynamics of Ethnicity (CoDE) is Europe's leading research centre on ethnicity (www.ethnicity.ac.uk). The Centre has undertaken extensive research concerned with understanding the dynamics of ethnic populations, ethnic inequalities and identities. This project will draw on 2011 Census aggregate tables and 2011 Census microdata to examine the settlement patterns and characteristics of EU migrant families in England and Wales. The analysis carried out for this project will be included in a research briefing for the Migration and Families in Europe Network, a new initiative developed under CoDE aiming to increase understanding about the experiences of migrant families in Europe and help influence policy developments.
