#### • Changes within the Faculty Senior Management Team

As you will be aware, I have been appointed to the role of Programme Director for a new University-wide Programme Board, which is being set up to manage strategic projects and activities across the University. The Board will be led by Deputy President and Deputy Vice-Chancellor, Colin Bailey. Recruitment to the Humanities Director of Faculty Operations role will begin immediately. In the meantime, I have already begun to take on some activities associated with this new role, while still continuing in my Faculty role until a replacement is appointed.

Also, Humanities Director of Faculty Finance, Ian Rodd, is moving to the Faculty of Science and Engineering as Head of Faculty Finance. Philippa Woods has been appointed as Interim Head of Faculty Finance, and will support the Faculty until a permanent appointment is made.

Finally, the Head of the School of Environment, Education and Development, Professor Tim Allott, is now in the final year of his three-year term and will step down as Head of School in July 2017. The recruitment process to identify a replacement will begin shortly.

This was the last of four School websites redeveloped as part of phase one of the Faculty Web Team's responsive web design project — a project which involved the entire team, the redevelopment of thousands of web pages, and which took 12 months to complete. Phase Two of this project, currently underway, involves the redevelopment of websites for research institutes and centres.
