New Fellowship Opportunity for 2016-2017:

Newberry Library–John Rylands Research Institute Exchange Fellowship

This new fellowship provides two months of support—one for work at the <u>Newberry Library</u> in Chicago, Illinois, USA, and one for work at the <u>John Rylands</u> <u>Research Institute</u> (at The John Rylands Library) in Manchester, England. The proposed project must incorporate the collections from both libraries. Applicants should set aside two consecutive months for this fellowship, to ensure continuity of research. All application materials will be **submitted to the Newberry**, but applications will be reviewed by both institutions. The stipend will be \$2,500 per month at the Newberry, £1,500 at the John Rylands Research Institute, plus an additional \$1,000 (or the equivalent in English pounds) for travel.

The Newberry-Rylands Fellowships are available to postdoctoral scholars, PhD candidates, and those who hold other terminal degrees. This fellowship is restricted to scholars who live and work outside the Chicago Metro area and are external to the University of Manchester. This fellowship will be awarded for one continuous month in residence at the Newberry and a contiguous month in residence and The John Rylands Library. Applicants must demonstrate a specific need for each collection. All applicants must follow the instructions listed on the Newberry's <u>How to Apply</u> webpage
