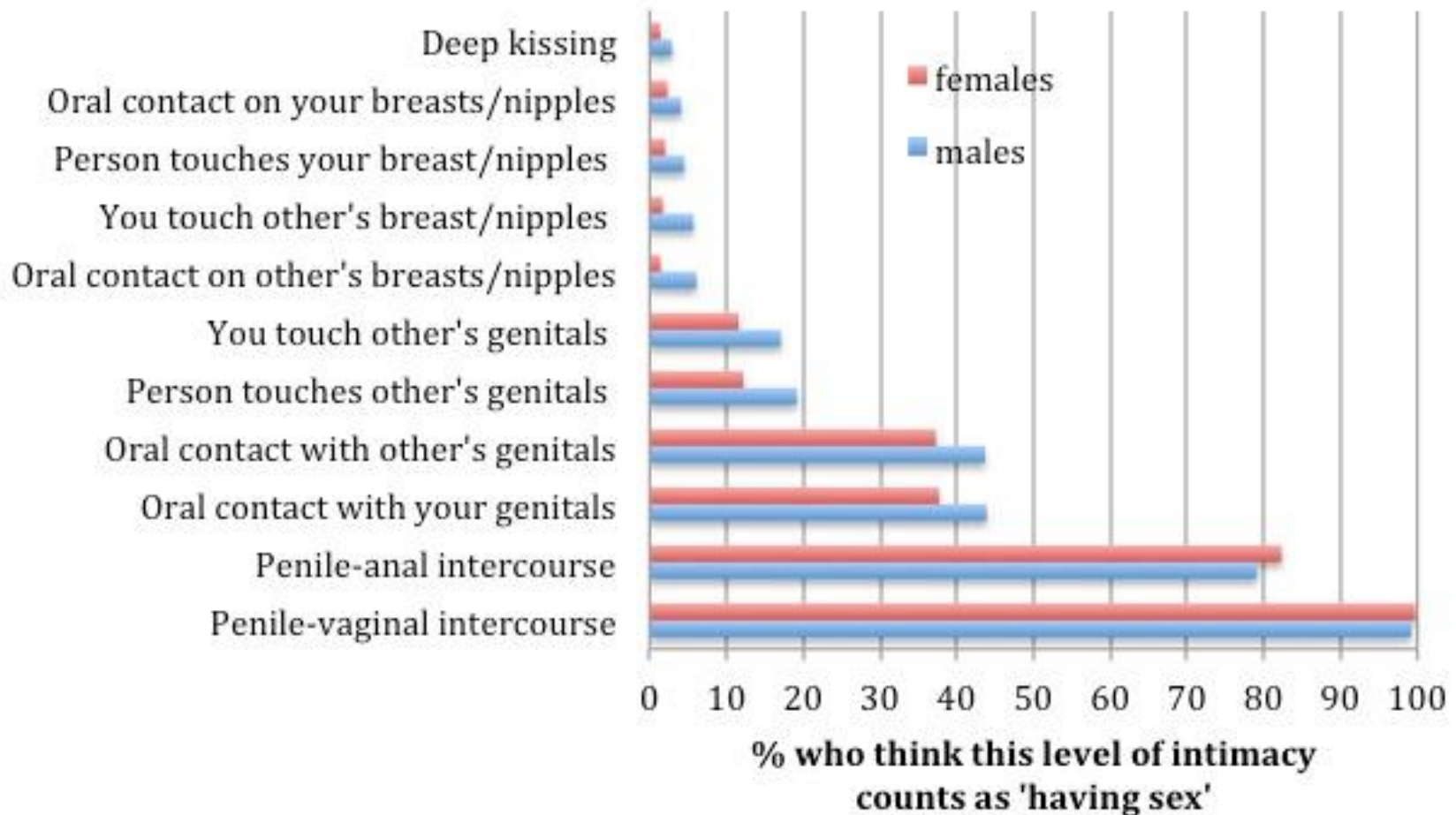


Figure XX What 599 US students thought of as 'having sex'

Giving star ratings to data

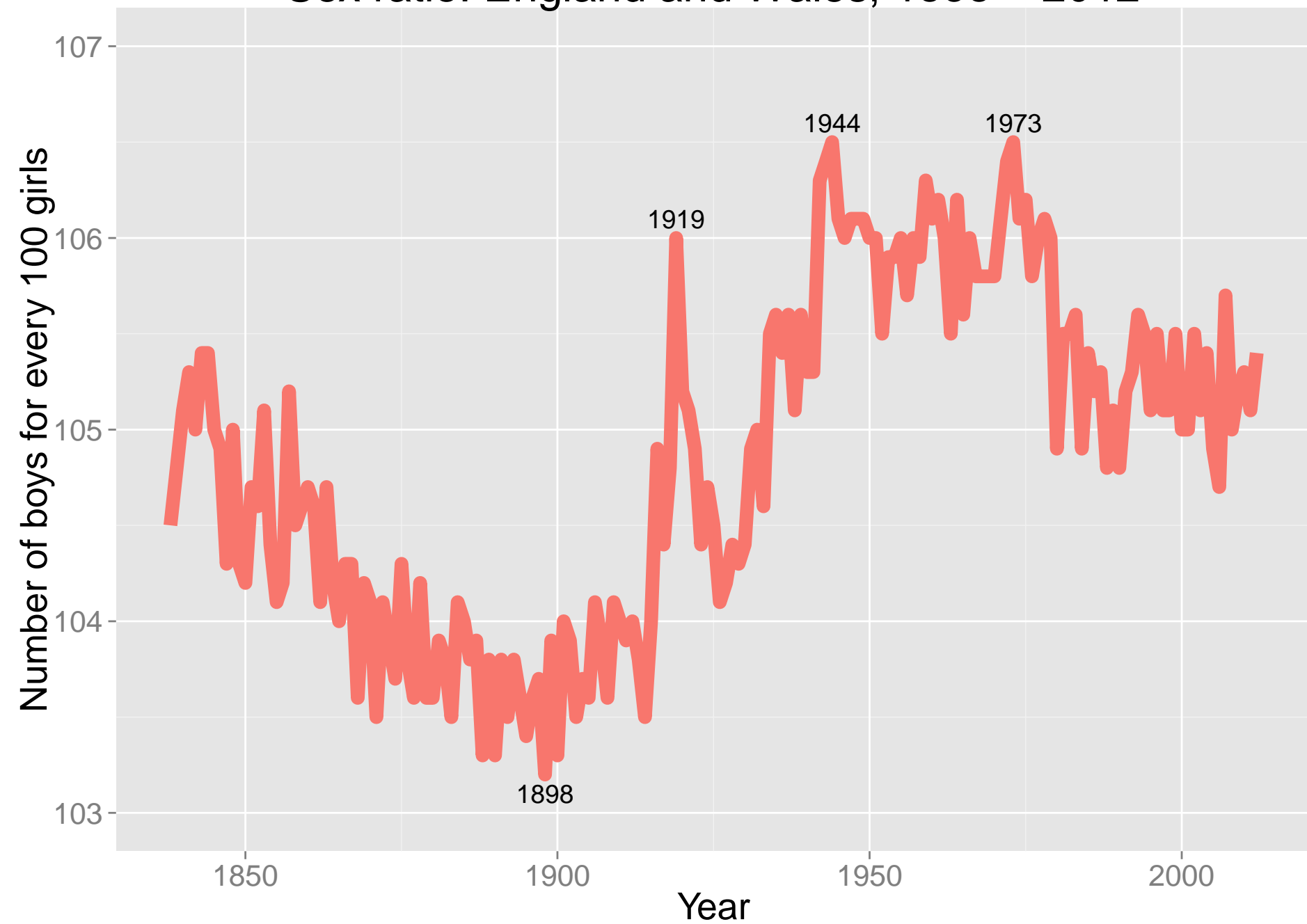
- ***** we can, to all intents and purposes, believe the numbers – eg good official statistics
- *** reasonably reliable numbers, with errors that are unlikely to make substantial difference. Up to around 20% up or down eg good surveys
- ** can be used as a very rough ballpark figures, but details are unreliable. 20% to 100% errors. eg internet panels
- * could well be more than double or half the answer. Eg terrible volunteer 'surveys'

Some 4* stats

- 48% of births in 2012 were formally 'illegitimate'
- In 1973, one in twenty 16-year-old girls got pregnant.
- For every 20 girls born, 21 boys are born.
- In 1938, at least half of brides under 20 were pregnant when they got married.

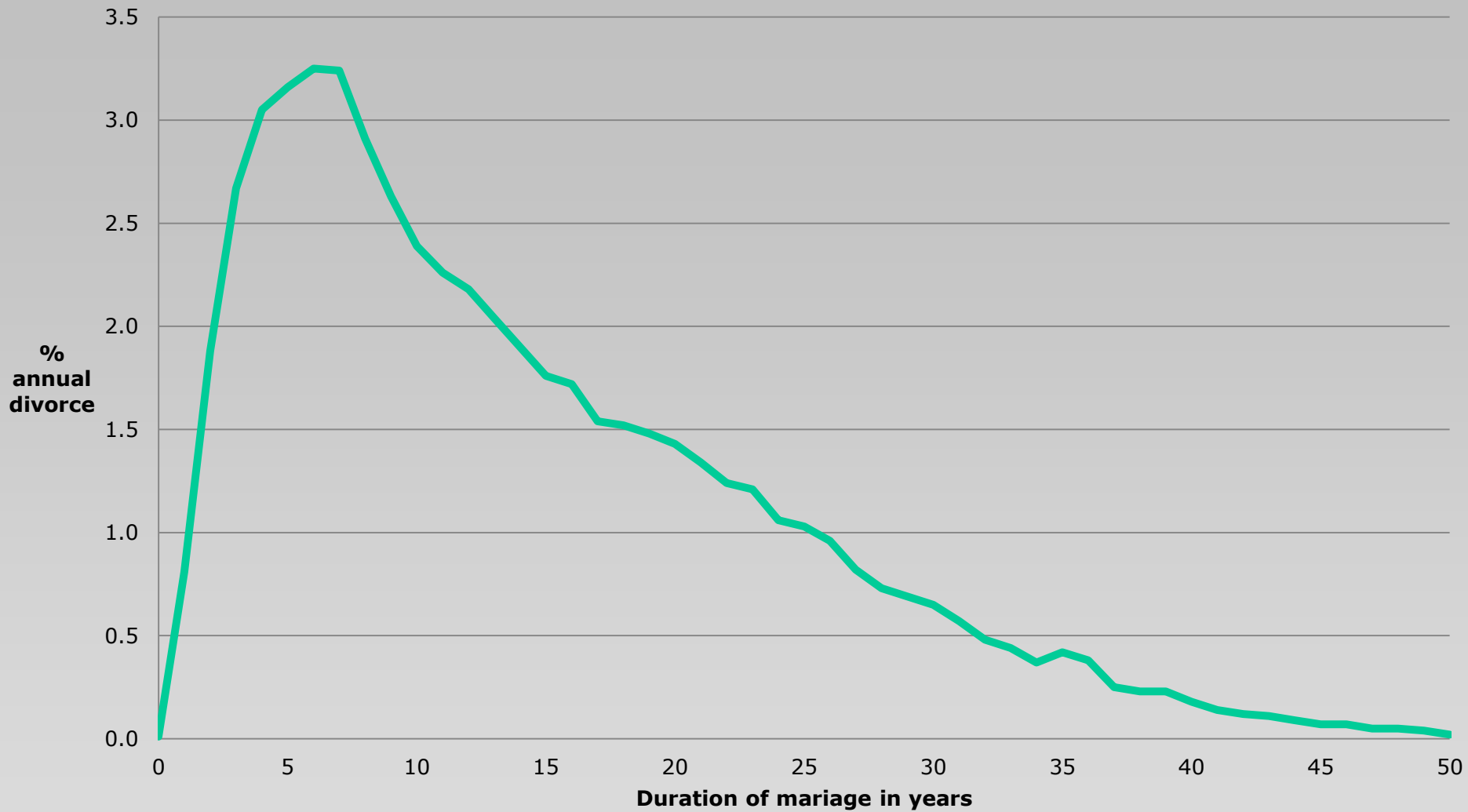
Sex ratio: England and Wales, 1838 – 2012

Sexual attitudes and lifestyles in Britain: Natsal-3

- 15,162 men and women aged 16-74 in 2010-2012
- Overall response rate: 66% of those contacted
- CASI (Computer-Assisted Self-Interview)

Some 3* stats (Natsal)

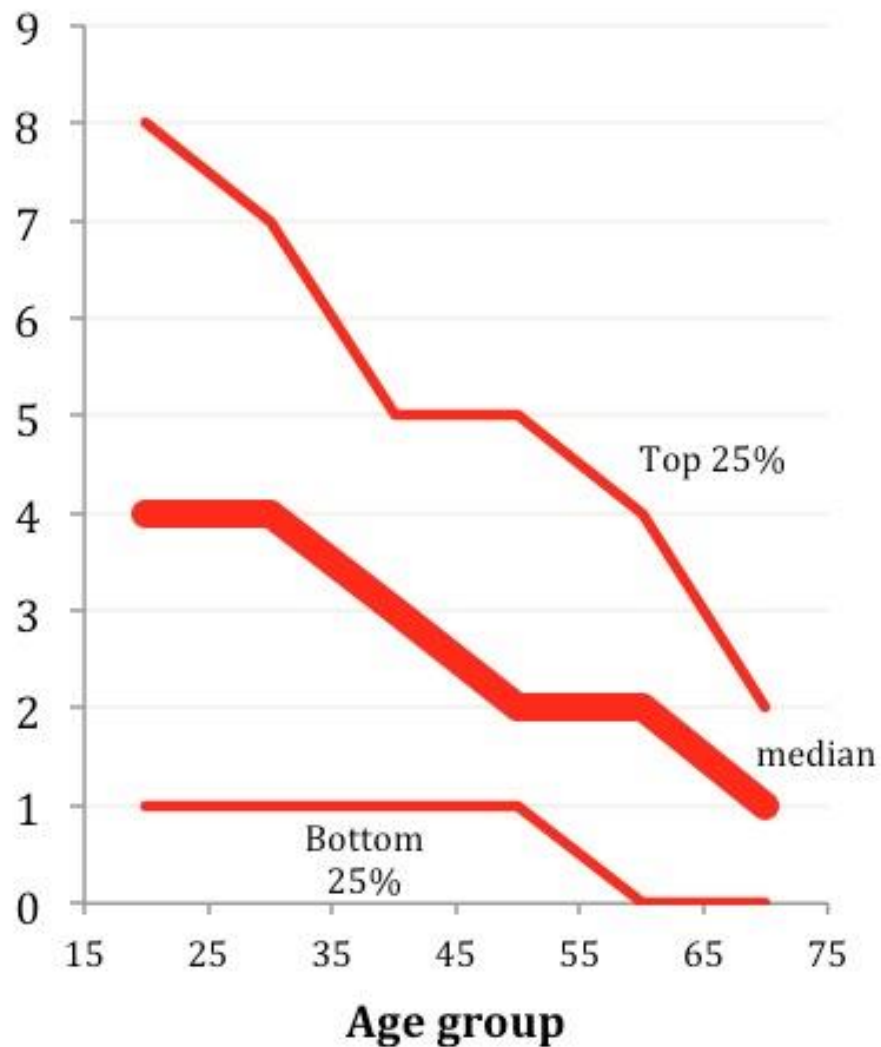
- Median age at female first sex:
 - 19 for those born around 1940,
 - 16 for those born around 1980.
- Median 4-week frequency of sex for 16-44s:
 - 5 in 1990
 - 3 in 2010
- One in five 16- to 24-year-old women reported sexual experience with another woman, greatly increased from 1990.

Britons having sex less often

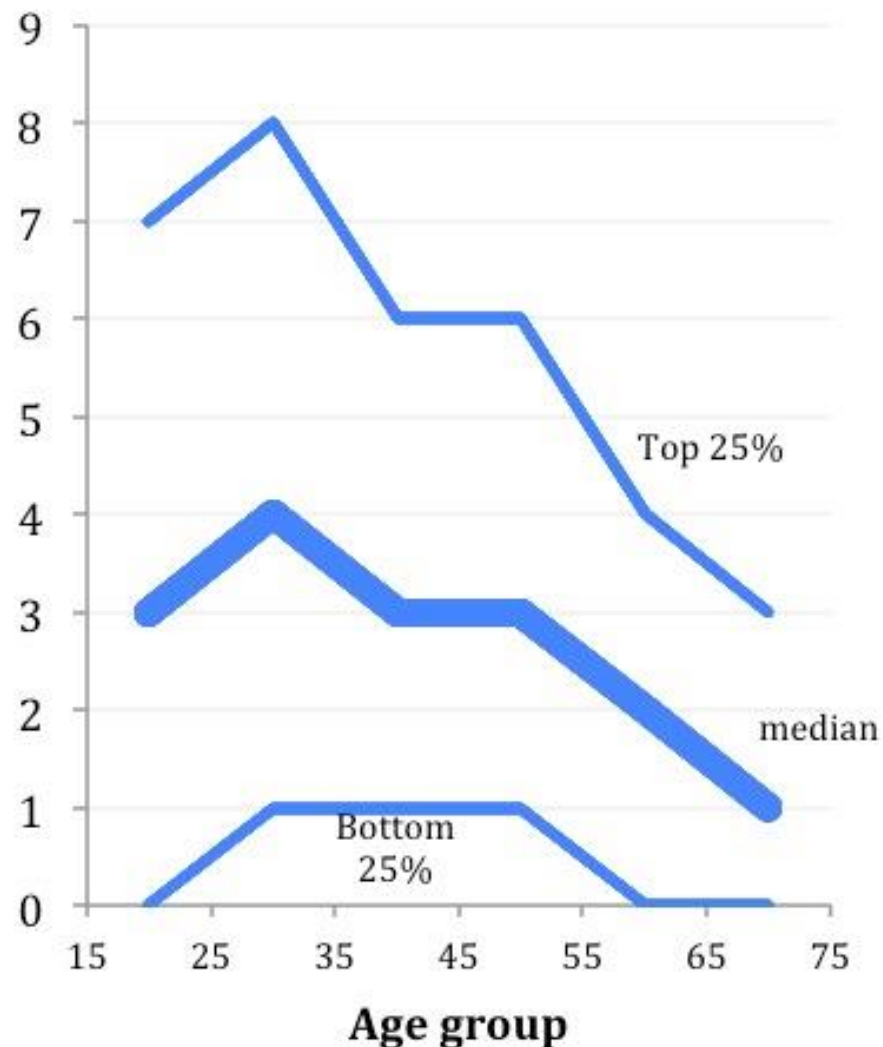
National Survey of Sexual Attitudes and Lifestyles finds frequency of sex has fallen by 20% since last survey in 2000



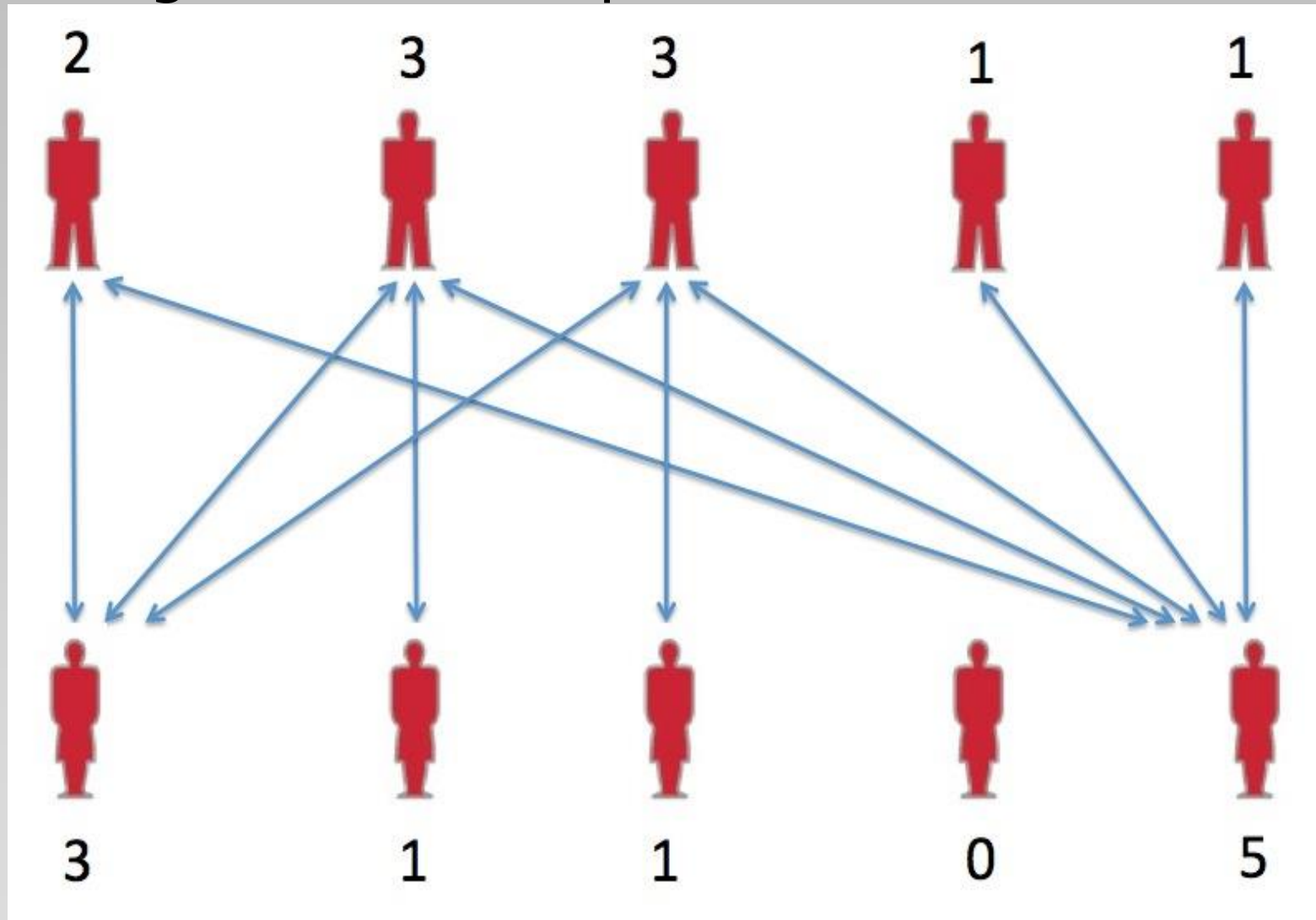
Frequency of sex in last 4 weeks: sexually active women

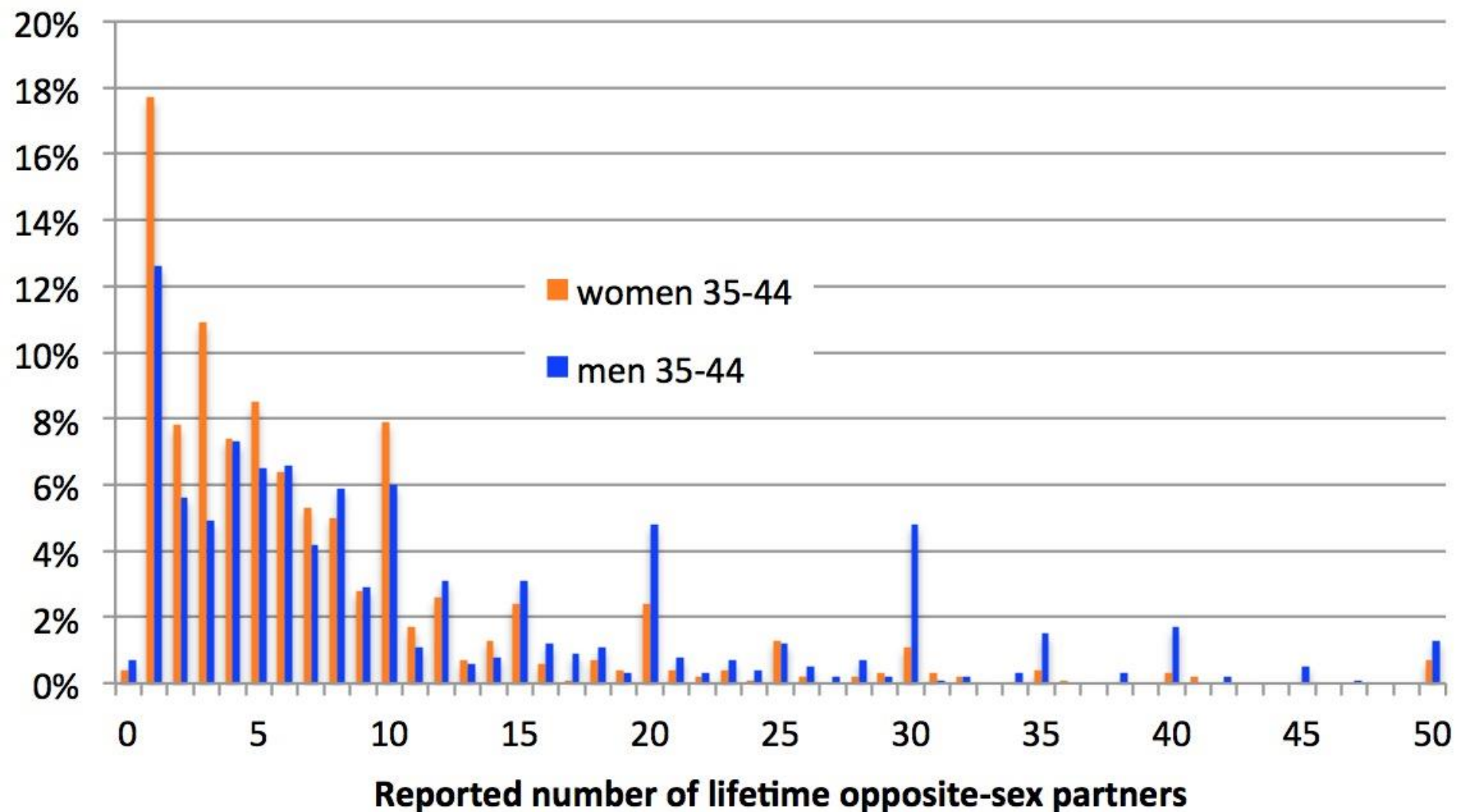

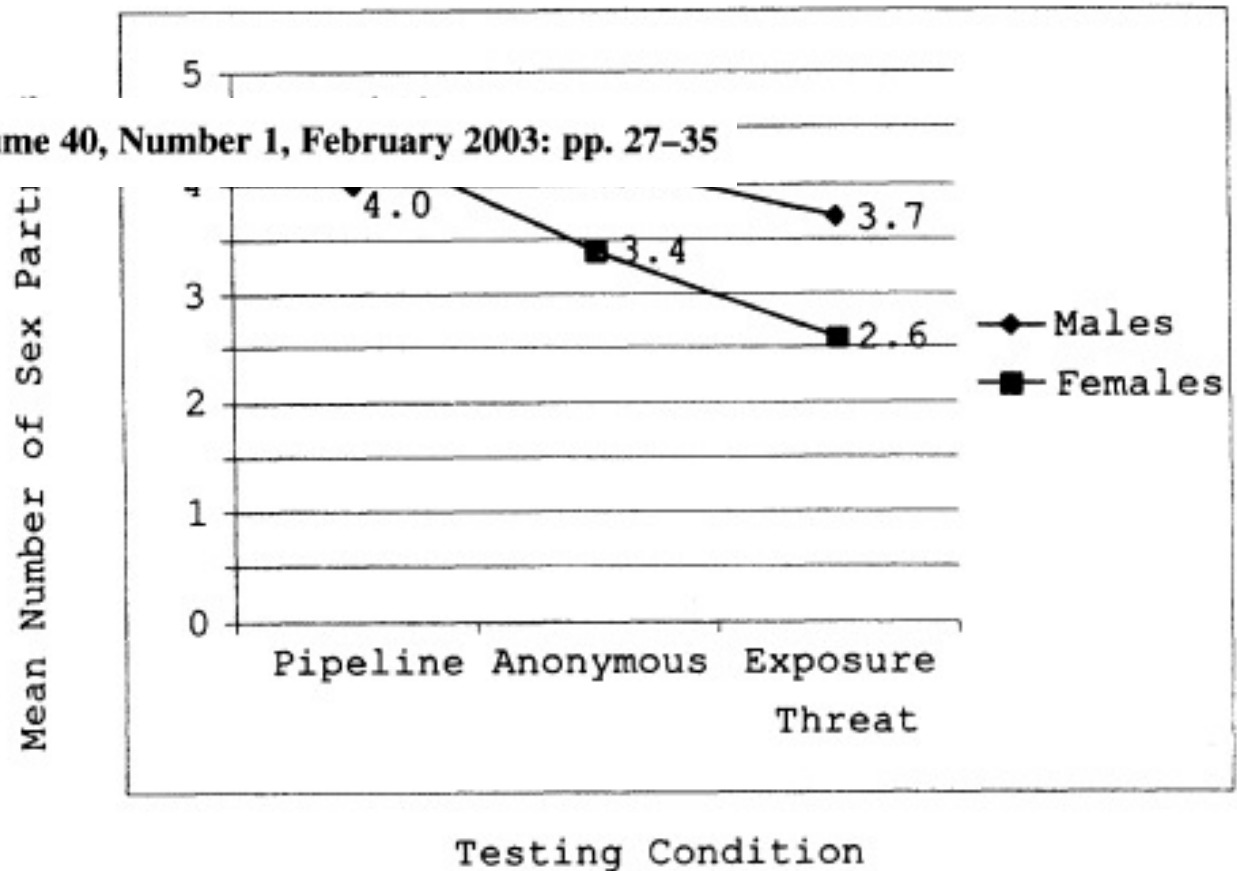

Figure 2. Mean number of sexual partners as a function of participant sex and testing condition.



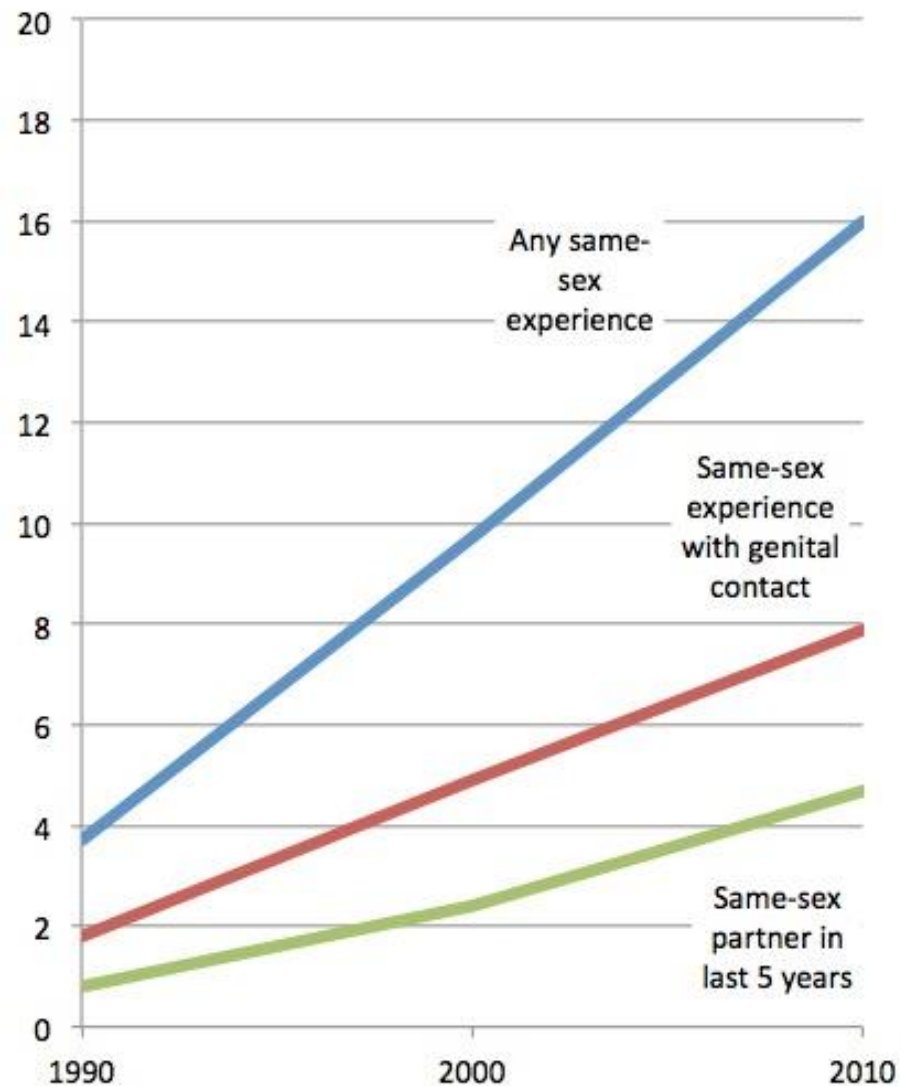

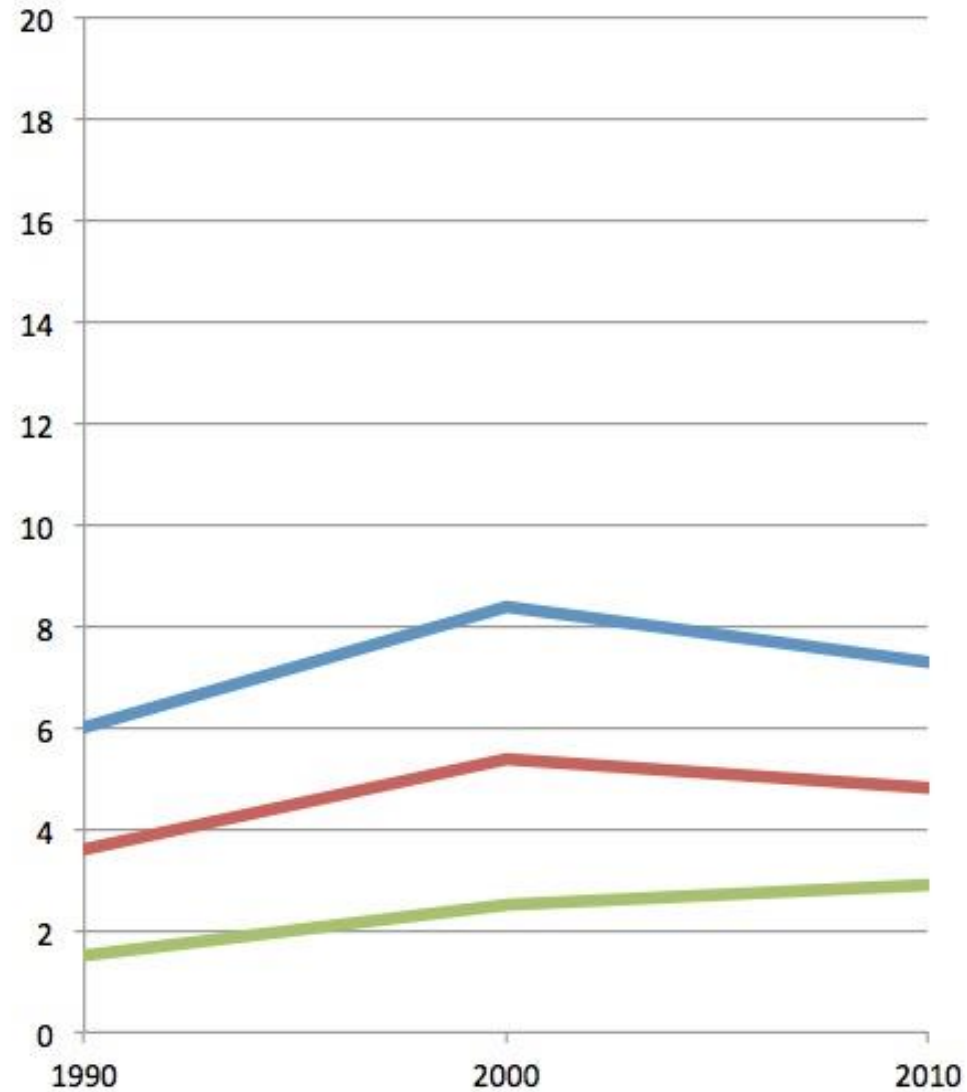

1* The sample size is big – 10,042 people

But 'the sample consists of those who chose to fill out our sex survey online.'

Shere Hite - 1970s



- *'4,000 women speak frankly'*
- Out of 100,000 given questionnaires

Some 1* stats (Shere Hite, 1970s)

- 84% of women were emotionally unsatisfied with their relationships
- 95% reported forms of 'emotional and psychological harassment' from their men
- 70% of women married for more than five years were having affairs.

Some forensic statistics....

- Claim: *70% of women married 5 years or more are having sex outside of their marriage*

Dr Clelia Mosher

- Lecturer at Stanford University
- Interviewed 45 women about their sex lives and attitudes in late 1890s
- Never published results
- Discovered in 1973, 23 years after she died



Report from 1892 from 25-year-old woman born in 1867

10. Habit of intercourse? Average number of times per week?

per month? *Two or three times per year?* *Before conception, once or at most twice per month.*

11. Was intercourse held during pregnancy? *No.* If so, a) how often?

b) did you desire it at this period? *Occasionally during first months, not at all, during last half - or more.*

12. At other times have you any desire for intercourse? *Yes.*

a) How often? *Once or twice a month.*

b) At what time in relation to your menses? *Immediately after.*

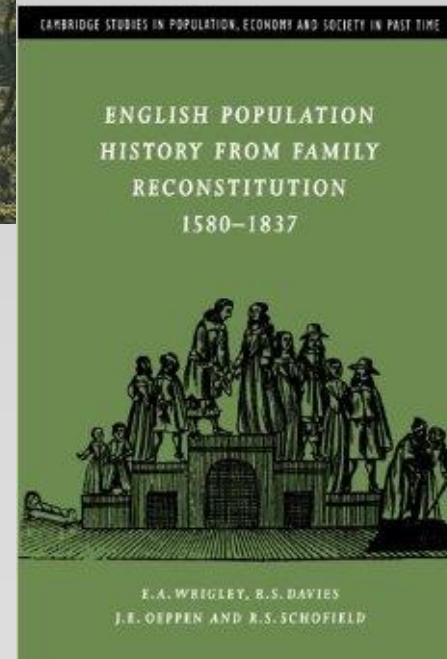
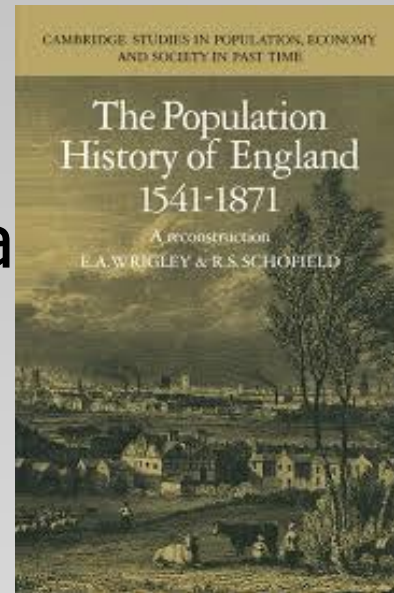
Occasionally, just before - and rarely at some other time. Except in 1st case, it is scarcely ever except when there is some outside exciting cause.

But generally there is silence...

- A few diaries....
- Infer behaviour from births and marriages..

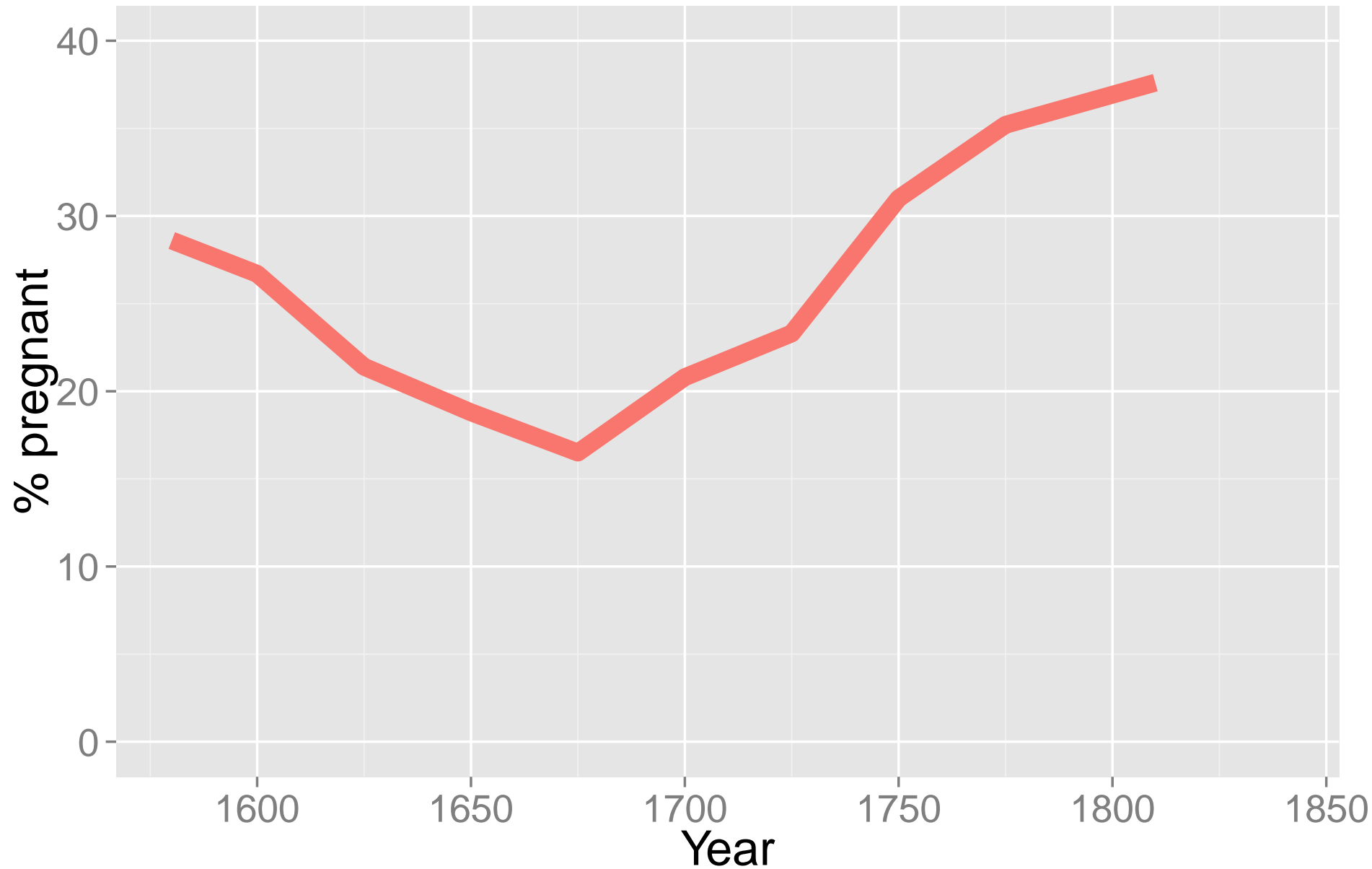
The Cambridge Group for the History of Population and Social Structure

- Started in 1964
- Volunteers collected data from 404 parishes
- 26 parishes chosen for 'family reconstitution' – matching records across marriages and births.

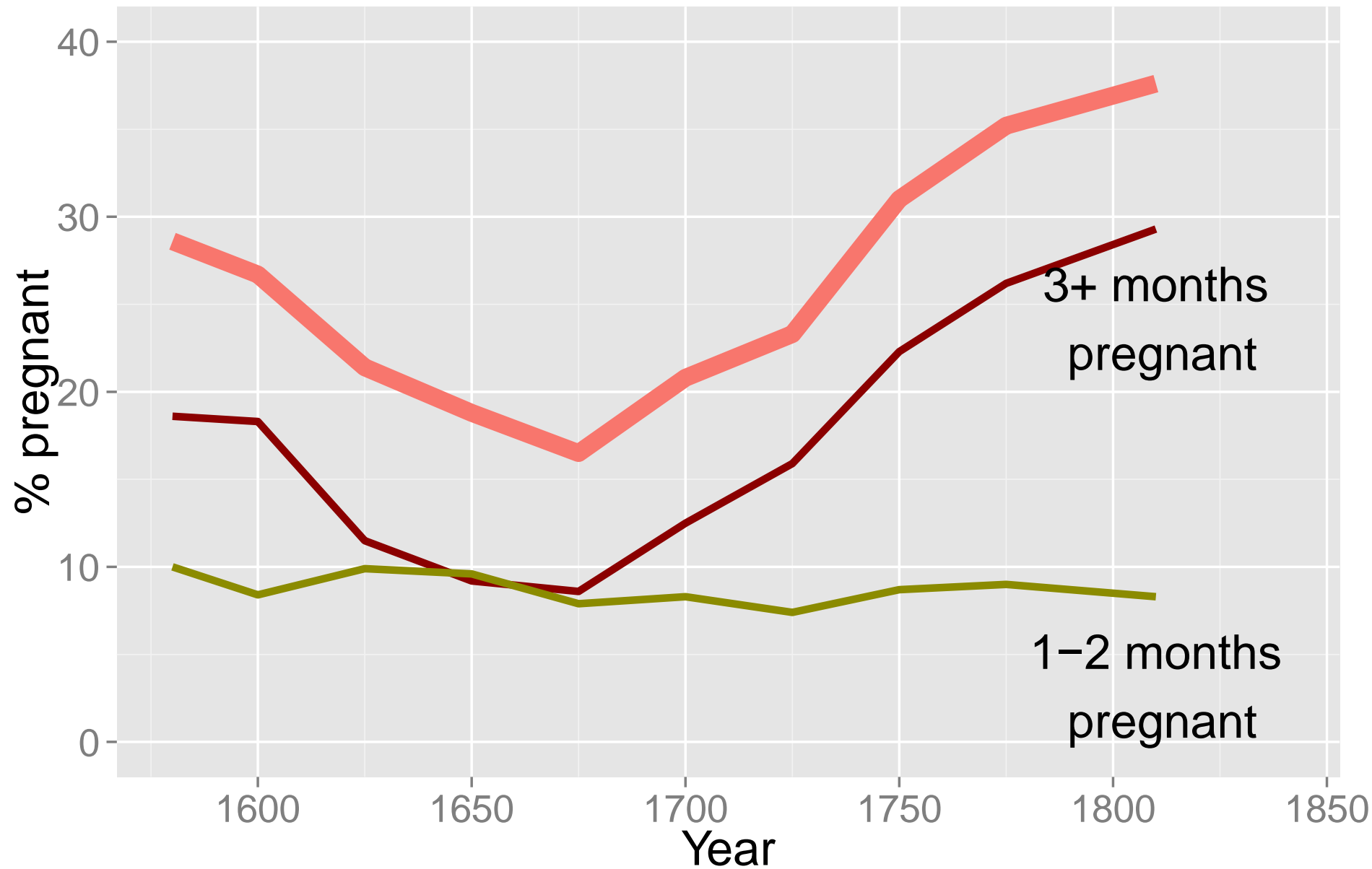


What proportion of brides have

married?

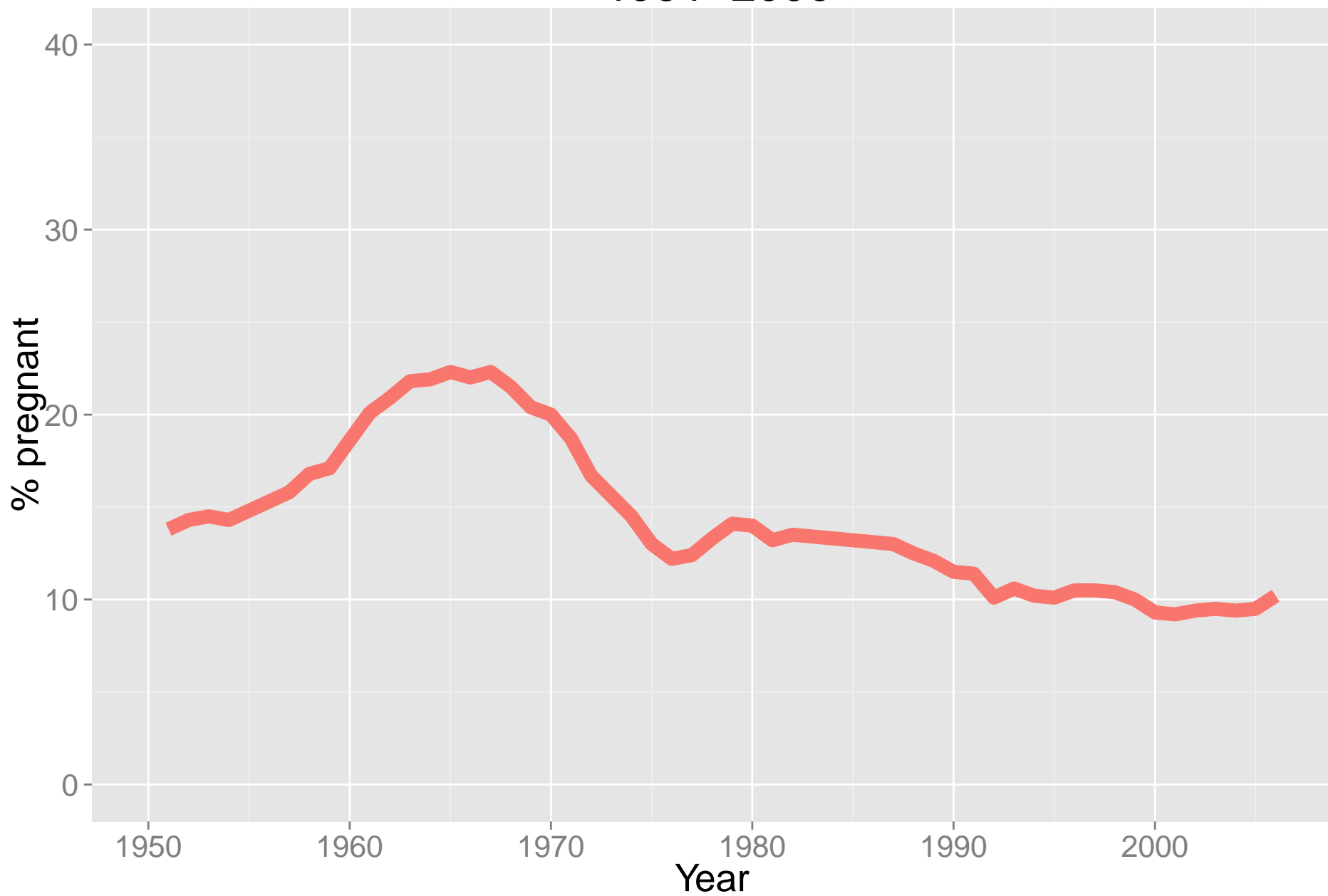
% brides pregnant when married: 1580–1820



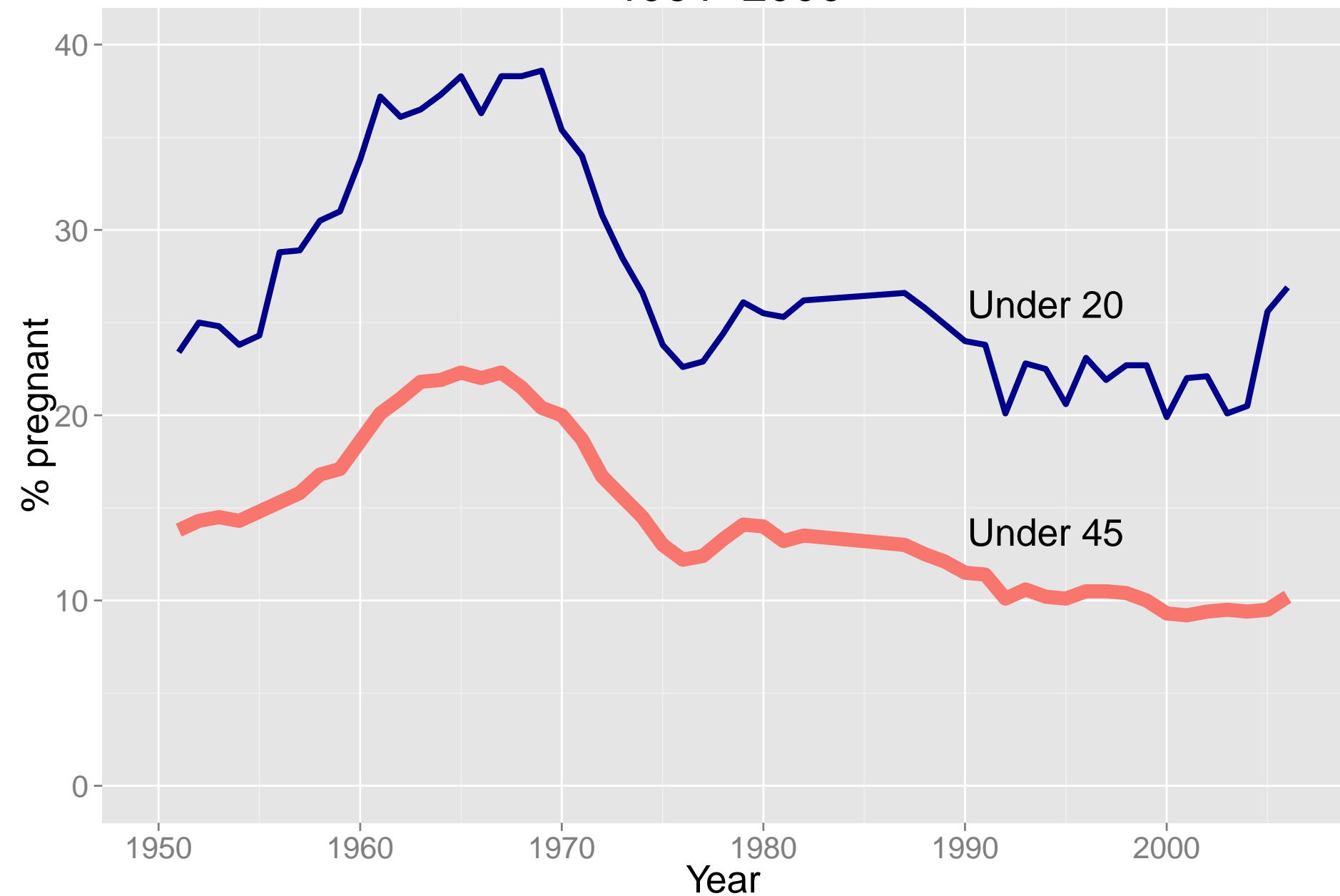
% brides pregnant when married: 1580–1820



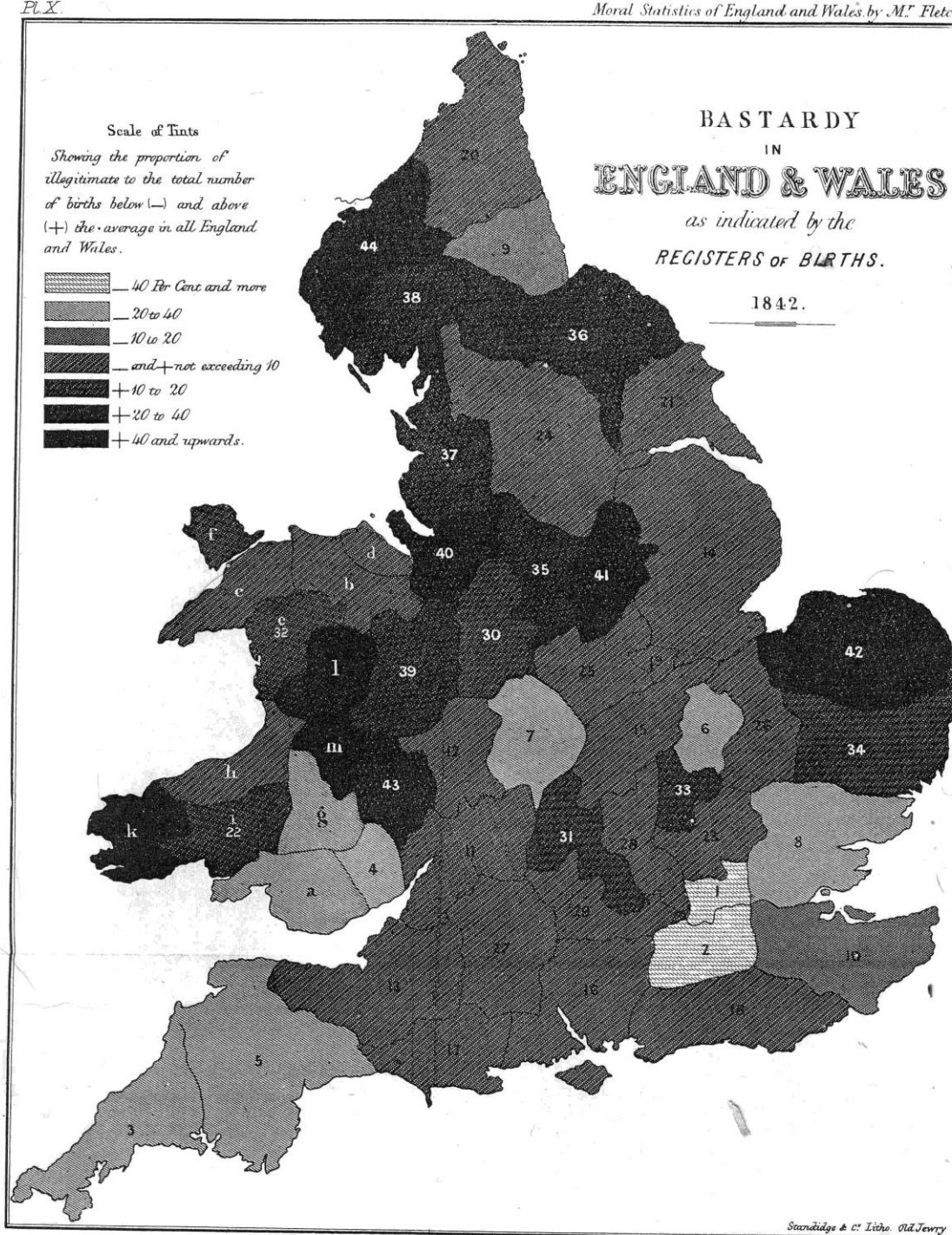
% brides pregnant when first married: 1951-2006



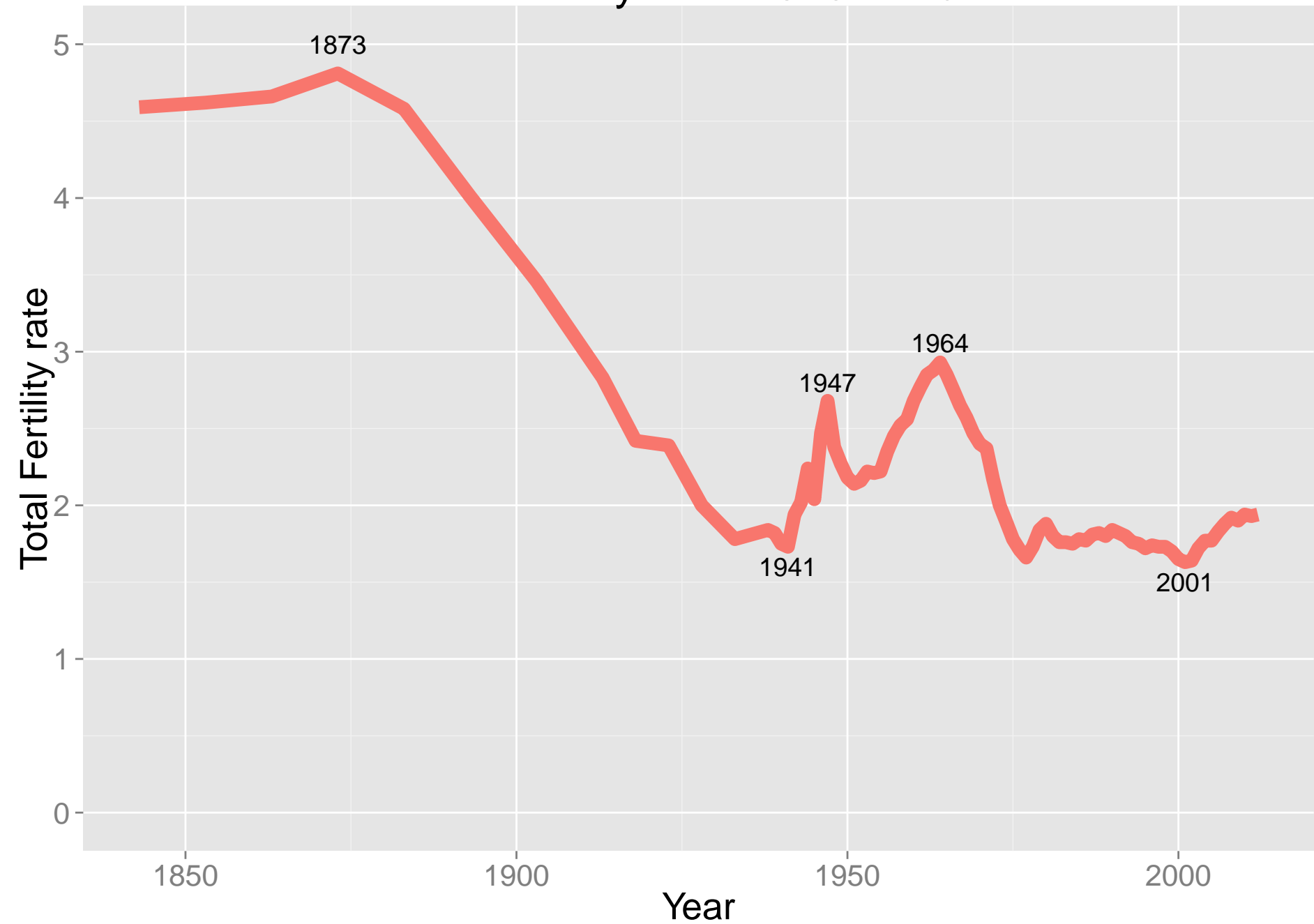
% brides pregnant when first married: 1951–2006

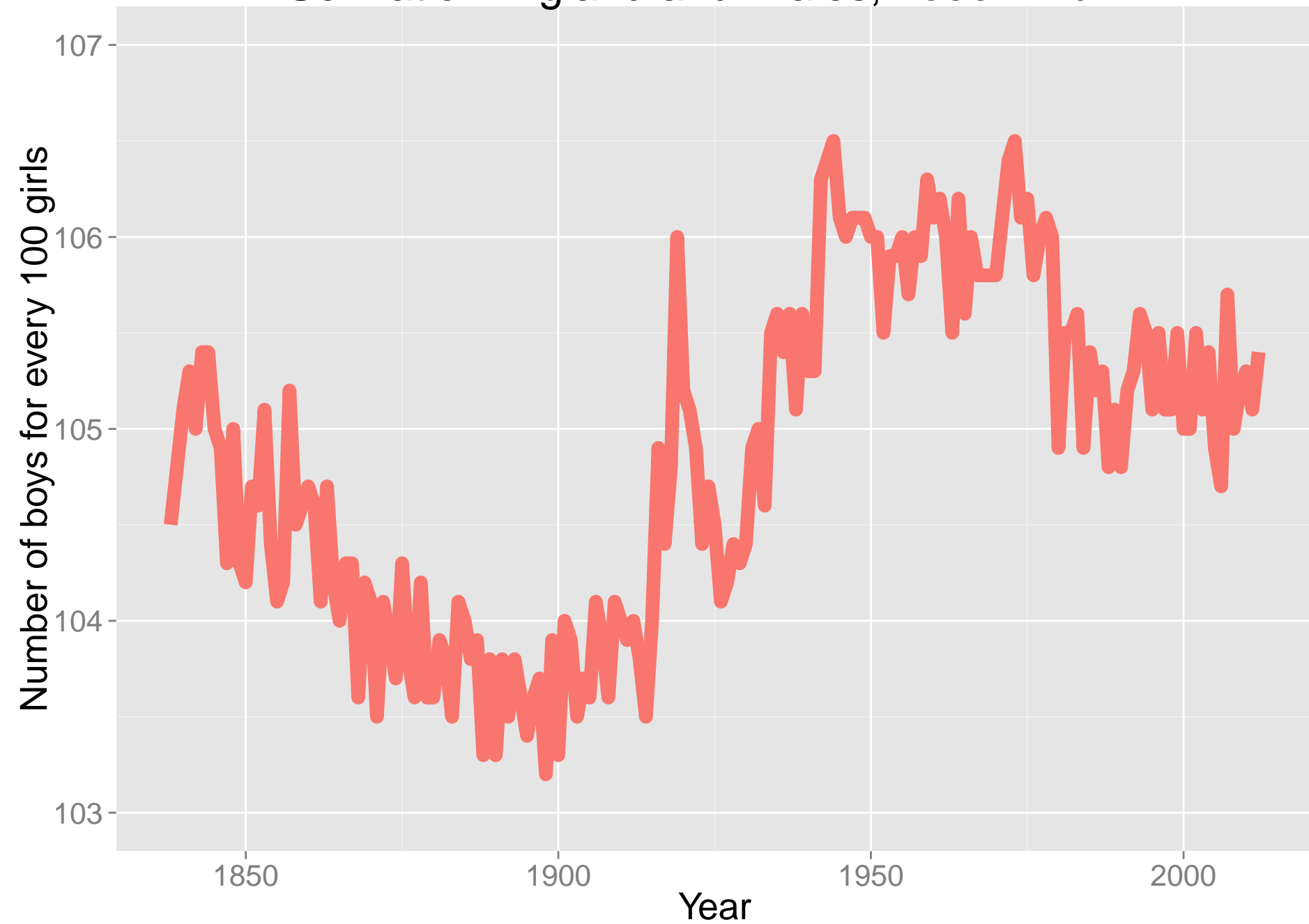
Total Fertility rate: 1843 to 2012



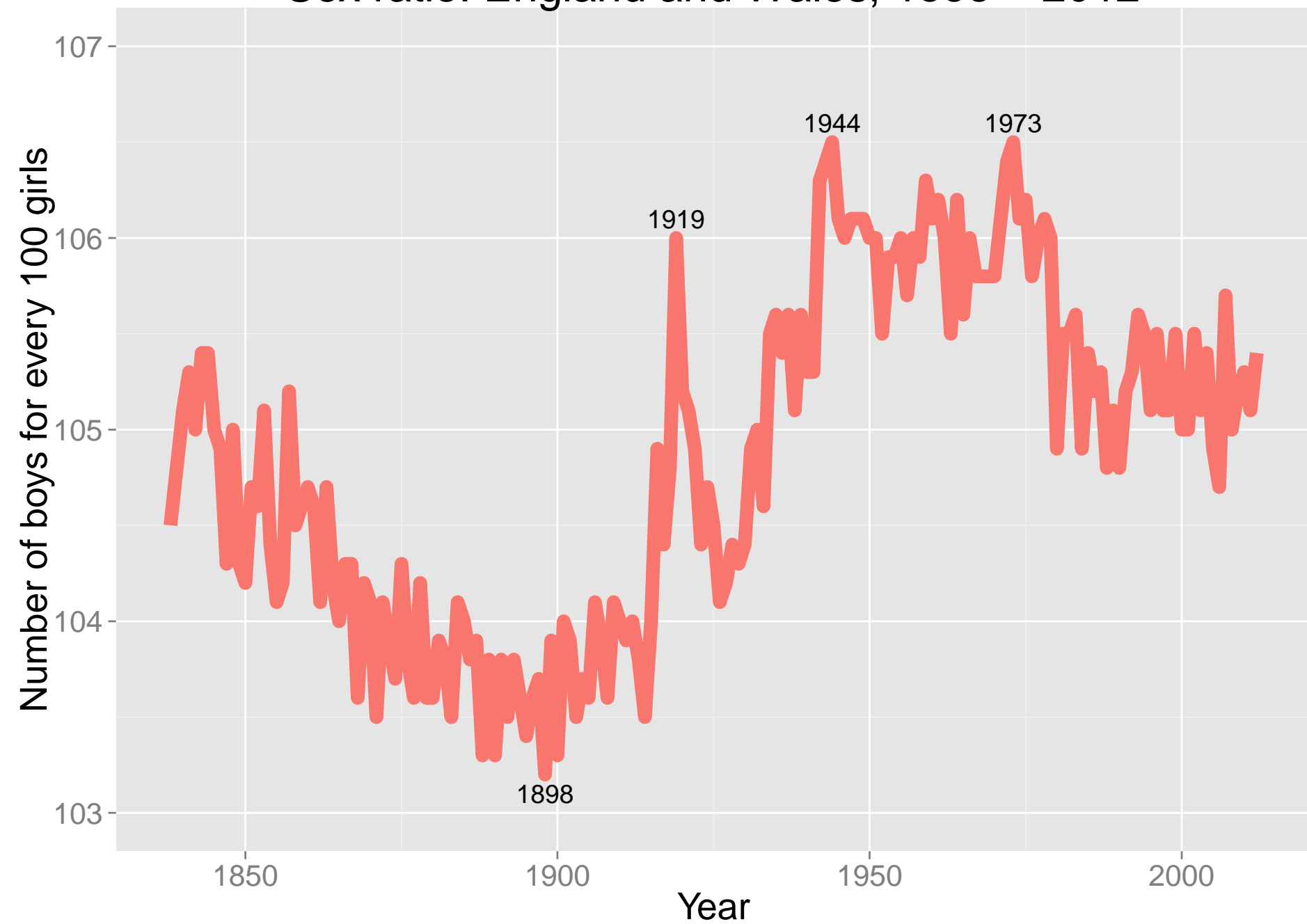
How many boys are born for every 100 girls?



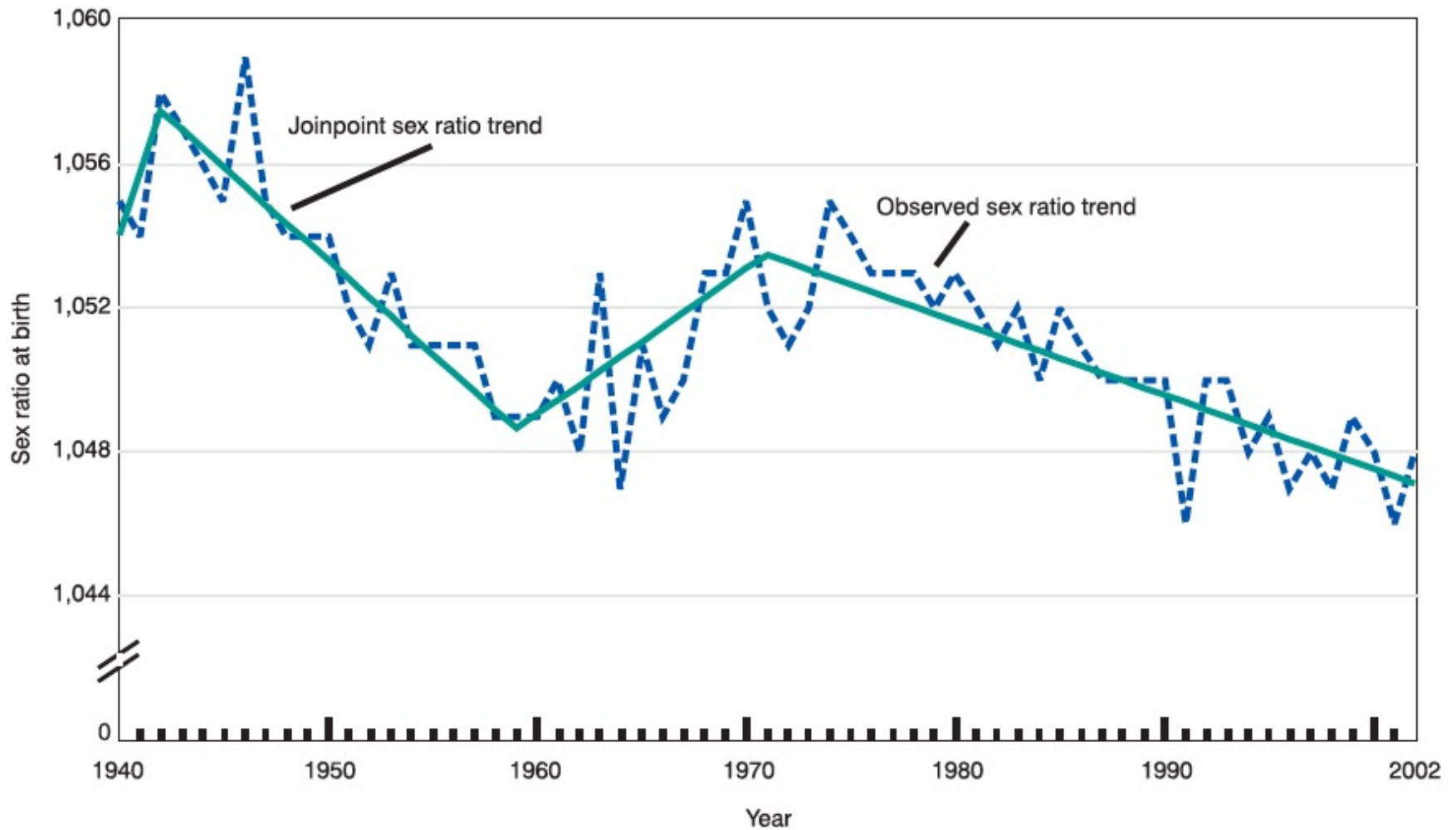
Sex ratio: England and Wales, 1838 – 2012

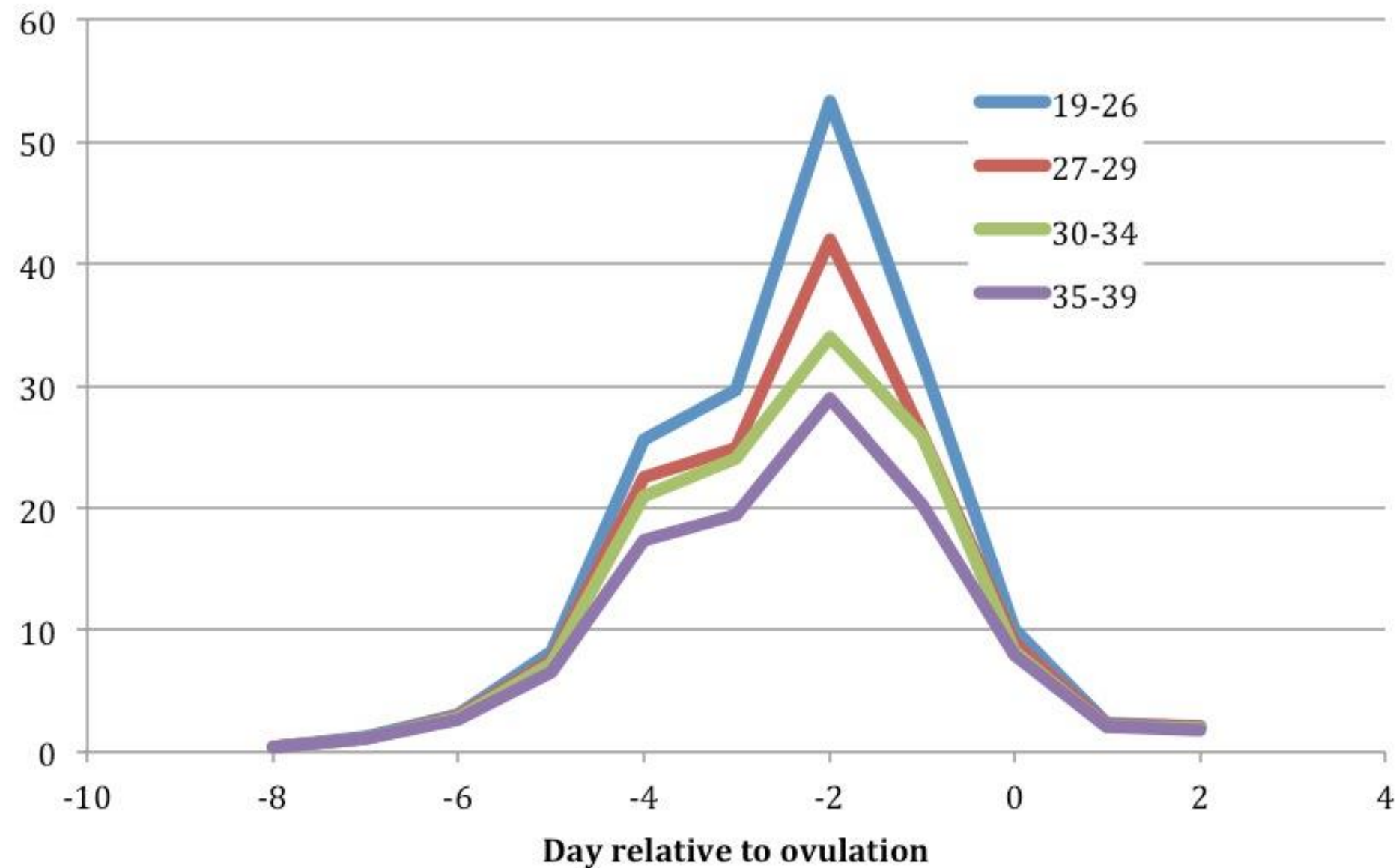
