The talk focuses on materials from an ethnographic study on the work of concierges in the Red Road highrise estate in Glasgow. The work of service professionals is not simply a 'social' practice, but servicing and maintenance are "means by which the constant decay of the world is held off" (Graham and Thrift). I will empirically demonstrate how highrise architecture is made and unmade in and through concierges' work practices.
