PGR – IND001 PGR HEALTH AND SAFETY INDUCTION MANDATORY MODULE 1

All new students and staff at The University of Manchester are required to complete a health and safety course. It is delivered online by the University's Health and Safety Services. The course delivers basic information about how health and safety is managed at the University, and includes some simple tests to assess learning outcomes.

You will automatically be enrolled on this course unit which is delivered through your eProg progression page which can be accessed via http://my.manchester.ac.uk/
It will take you approximately 1 hour to complete. You are expected to complete the course and obtain a "pass" within the first two weeks of the formal registration/welcome period (week commencing Monday 16 January 2017).

The good news is that you don't need to wait until you arrive on campus to complete the course. You can complete it once you have registered (online registration will be available from 1 January 2016). We would advise you to complete this unit as soon as you register so that you familiarise yourself with Blackboard and also so that you are free to concentrate on your other induction activities and your formal lectures/tutorials.

If you do not complete the course unit you may be prevented from accessing parts of the campus.
