Teaching and Learning

The course units are taught by our team of academics, many of whom are leaders in their fields. Course units incorporate lectures, seminars and workshops involving presentations, discussions and lively debate.

Assessment

All EdAP course units are credit rated and therefore include assessed work. Some are assessed by examination, but most assessment is made up of pieces of coursework, which could include essays, reports or presentations, with some elements being individual while others may involve group work.

Application Process

If you wish to take a EdAP course unit, please complete the attached application form and return it your home/registering School.

If you are a visiting/exchange student you should return your form to either the Study Abroad Unit or your Erasmus Coordinator. If your application is successful you can find details of the timetable information for course units outside A1.22 on the noticeboards in the Ellen Wilkinson Building or via the student portal.

Understanding course codes:

The first digit indicates the level of study, ie EDUC10711 is taught as a level 1 course unit and the last digit indicates the semester the course unit is taught in, ie EDUC10711 is taught in semester 1.
