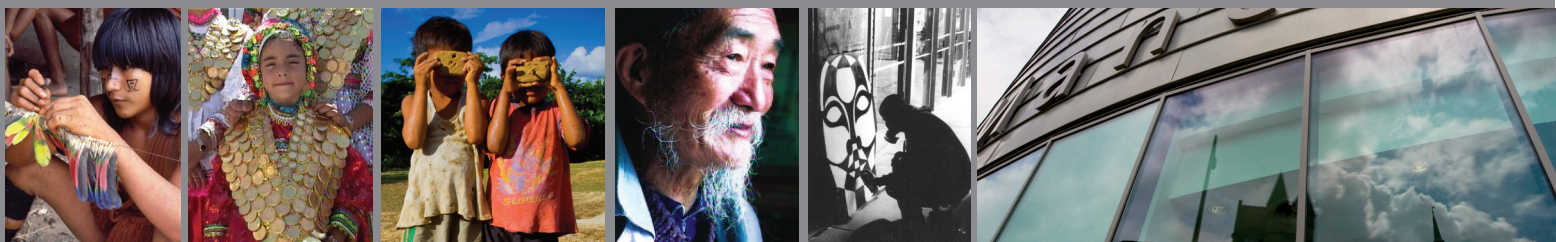
Why Study Social Anthropology?
